School Timeliness Research Project

Jefferson Elementary, April 2011

Objectives:

- Communicate with parents regarding the importance of regular and punctual school attendance
- Provide teachers with resources and strategies to increase on-time school attendance
- Identify strategies that prove most effective in ensuring students arrive to school on time regularly
- Inform decision making regarding tardy procedures for the 2011-2012 school year

Description:

In order to identify the strategies that are most effective in reducing the rate of tardiness for targeted students, each of the three 3rd grade classroom teachers will employ different methods to addressing tardies.

Target Audience:

Students whom have accumulated 12 or more tardies to date for the 2010-2011 school, and the parents/guardians of those students, will be targeted for this research project.

Duration:

April 18 – May 20, 2011 (5 weeks)

Implementation:

- Classroom Teachers: Regular and direct contact with parents utilizing specified strategies
- Social Worker and Communities In Schools: Provide support to parents and students as needed; regular and direct contact with students
- MTSS Family Engagement Facilitators: Provide training and resources to teachers; compile data;
 share findings with Jefferson administration; offer recommendations for 2011-2012 school year

Documentation:

- Parent Contact Sheet will be maintained for each of the targeted students for the duration of the 6 week period
- Post-Assessment will be completed for each of the targeted students at the end of the 6 week period
- Attendance Records for each of the targeted students will be utilized to evaluate effectiveness of individual strategies

Ms. Keith 4 students targeted

- Send the Every Minute Counts flyer home with all students in the class during Week 1
- Make weekly positive contacts with the each family of targeted students; the purpose of the positive contact is relationship building and should not specifically address tardies
- Maintain a Parent Contact Sheet for each of the targeted students
- Complete a Post-Assessment for each of the targeted students

Classroom Teachers

Ms. Mauk 6 students targeted

- Send the Every Minute Counts flyer home with all students in the class during Week 1
- Have an open, honest conversation about tardies with the parent/guardian of each of the targeted students during Week 1; conversations should remain positive and not seem punitive (Script provided)
- Determine root causes of tardies and offer support when appropriate; collaboration with Social Worker and Communities In Schools will be beneficial
- Provide a weekly attendance update to parents of each of the targeted students
- Maintain a Parent Contact Sheet for each of the targeted students
- Complete a Post-Assessment for each of the targeted students

Ms. Ellis 9 students targeted

- Send the Every Minute Counts flyer home with all students in the class during Week 1
- Make a positive contact with parent/guardian of targeted students each day the student arrives on time; the positive contact should specifically address the student arriving to school on time
- Maintain a Parent Contact Sheet for each of the targeted students
- Complete a Post-Assessment for each of the targeted students

Social Worker/Communities In Schools

The Social Worker and Communities In Schools may choose to do any combination of the following:

- Communicate regularly with classroom teachers in order to connect targeted students and families to resources
- Establish "Sunshine Club" with students; daily contact with students to offer positive reinforcement for being on time (may also utilize incentives)
- Coordinate sessions for targeted students to make positive posters about punctuality and attendance to hang in school entryway
- Maintain documentation of tardy-related contacts with students and families

- Targeted Coffee at the Curb that starts at 9:00
 AM; single event or weekly
- Facilitate weekly Life Skills group with targeted students (ex: time management, punctuality, etc.)
- Collaborate with classroom teachers to organize a parent meeting for families of targeted students to communicate the importance of being on time and offer tips and support
- Partner with area businesses, churches and/or organizations to support this effort (ex: provide funding for incentives for students and families)
